CALL TO ORDER

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Buckner, Missouri, met in a Business Session on May 6, 2021 in the Council Chambers located in Buckner City Hall. Mayor Darrel Box called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

MINUTES

Alderman Butts made the motion to approve the April 15, 2021 Study Session Minutes. Alderman Norris seconded; all Aldermen voted aye.

OLD BUSINESS

1. BILL NO. 21-01 ORDINANCE NO.1050 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 215.040 OF THE CITY OF BUCKNER, MISSOURI MUNICIPAL CODE.

Alderman Butts made a motion to approve second reading. Alderman Norris seconded the motion. Roll Call vote: Alderman Butts, Alderman Jones, Alderman Ross, Alderman Walcott, Alderman Norris, and Alderman Kolle voted aye.

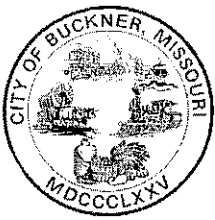
2. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding dates for the City-Wide Cleanup and Garage Sales.

City Administrator Bobadilla explained that in the past the trash company has always charged the city just for the dumping fees, around \$2,300, and did not charge for the dumpster or the driver's time. The City Administrator also stated that currently the trash company is holding June 5, 2021 as the day for the clean-up. In the past the City-Wide Garage sale was a week prior to the clean up day which will be May 28-31. Alderman Norris made a motion to approve. Alderman Butts seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

NEW BUSINESS

1. APPROVAL OF April 6, 2021 GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS CERTIFICATION.

Alderman Jones made a motion to approve. Alderman Butts seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

2. SWEARING IN OF ALDERMEN.

Alderman Butts, Alderman Walcott, Alderman Norris, and Alderman Kolle took their Oath of Office.

3. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding approving bids for sealcoating.

Mayor Box stated that the bid results are included in the packet. Alderman Jones stated that Phillips Paving was the company that the City has used in the past, that they had always done a good job and were only \$960 higher than the lowest bidder. Alderman Jones also stated that the lowest bidder did not provide detailed information as to what their job would consist of versus the other two bidders. Alderman Jones made a motion to approve Phillips Paving Bid. Alderman Butts seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

4. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding waiving the food truck vendor ordinance.

Alderman Butts stated that the Park Board was planning on having food trucks at the fireworks display in the park, as well as, the Fairs and Festival for the annual carnival in the downtown area. Alderman Butts made a motion to waive the food truck vendor ordinance for these two city sponsored events to include the \$500 business license and the 200 feet from any restaurants downtown. Alderman Kolle seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

5. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding upgrading the license for Omnigo software.

Police Chief Sutherland stated that the city could save money by upgrading their current license which is purchased per seat to an unlimited license plan. Alderman Jones made a motion to approve. Alderman Ross seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

6. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION, AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding wastewater and sewer projects for the American Rescue Plan Act.

Jim Ross from Bartlett & West Engineering gave a presentation of projects that would be covered by the American Rescue Plan Act. That included a SCADA system for both the water infrastructure and the treatment plant, wet flow monitoring, cleaning, and televising sewer mains and CIPP lining identified sewer lines. Alderman Jones asked if these projects could be scaled back depending on how much money the city will get from this act. Jim Ross stated that it could. City Administrator Bobadilla stated that Bartlett & West would take on the project management role which means they will be able to use companies that they currently have agreements with on these projects. Alderman Norris made a motion to approve. Alderman Butts seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

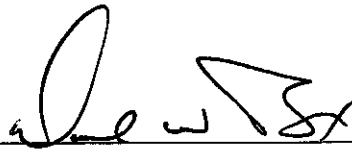
Alderman Butts made a motion to amend the agenda to discuss the repairs needed at the Echo Ridge Lift Station. Alderman Jones seconded the motion. City Administrator Bobadilla stated that the second motor at the Echo Ridge lift station has failed and needs repair. Bobadilla explained that the cost to buy a new motor was \$403.00 more expensive than to repair the motor. Alderman Jones made a motion to buy a new motor for the cost of \$7,101.75 including parts and labor. Alderman Norris seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

ELECTED OFFICIAL COMMENTS

Mayor Box asked about the status of the Government Channel. City Administrator Bobadilla stated that he talked with our IT company and they are waiting on parts from Comcast.
