**Board of Alderman Meeting Minutes**  
*Business Session*

08/04/2022

**CALL TO ORDER**

The Board of Aldermen of the City of Buckner, Missouri, met in a Business Session on August 4, 2022, in the Council Chambers located in Buckner City Hall. Mayor Darrel Box called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The following Aldermen were present:

The following staff members were present: Police Chief Sutherland, City Attorney Steve Mauer, and public works employee JD Moffet and Robert Hunter.

**MINUTES**

Alderman Butts made the motion to approve the July 21, 2022, Study Session Minutes. Alderman Walcott seconded; all Aldermen voted aye. Alderman Ross made a motion to amend the agenda to discuss DJ services for the Fall Festival under new business and the additional repairs to the bobcat under old business. Alderman Kolle seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS**

**OLD BUSINESS**

**1. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding additional repairs to the bobcat.**

City Administrator Bobadilla stated that the bobcat skid steerer needs new tracks for an additional cost of \$4,112.40. Alderman Butts made a motion to approve the additional repairs. Alderman Jones seconded the motion. All Aldermen vote aye.

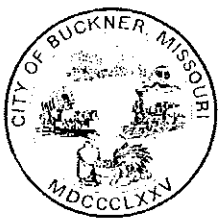
**NEW BUSINESS**

**1. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding the approval of the Stars and Bars contract for DJ services for the Fall Festival.**

Lesley Couch, President of the Fairs and Festival committee, stated that Stars and Bars will be providing DJ services for the Fall Festival for \$1,100.00. Alderman Jones made a motion to approve. Alderman Butts seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

**2. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding surplus property.**

City Administrator Bobadilla stated that the Park Board approved selling the train set water feature on Purple Wave auction site because it no longer fit their future water spray park theme. City Attorney Mauer stated that it was purchased for \$1,000.00 but, the delivery fee wasn't included in the sale price. The park board asked that if the unit sold for over the \$1,000.00 that any bids over that amount will be paid towards the delivery for of \$3,000.00 Alderman Butts made a motion to approve. Alderman Kolle seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.



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**3. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding the approval of proposal for assets management and appraisals.**

City Administrator Bobadilla stated that every year as part of our audit, we get hit by not having an updated assets management list that shows fair market value on all equipment over a \$1,000.00. Staff have received three bids for these services with the lowest bid by Certified Assets Appraisals for \$830.00. Alderman Butts made a motion to approve. Alderman Kolle seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

**4. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding the approval of a preventive maintenance agreement for the UV lighting system at the wastewater treatment plant.**

City Administrator Bobadilla stated that this is a yearly contract to have a factory representative come out and go through the entire UV system to get it fully operational. The cost of the agreement is \$7,494.00. Alderman Butts made a motion to approve. Alderman Ross seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.

**5. BILL NO. 22-07 ORDINANCE NO. 1069 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS OF THE CITY OF BUCKNER FOOD TRUCK MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER.**

Mayor Box stated that this amendment had all the changes that the board requested at the last meeting. Alderman Butts made a motion to suspend the rules and allow for a second reading by title only. Alderman Jones seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye. Alderman Jones made a motion to approve. Alderman Butts seconded the motion. Roll Call Vote as follows: Alderman Butts, Alderman Jones, Alderman Ross, Alderman Walcott, Alderman Norris, and Alderman Kolle voted aye.

**6. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding vehicles being parked on the roadway impeding traffic.**

Alderman Butts stated that vehicles are blocking the road at North Central and Stapleton, and North Hudson and Bart Street. Alderman Butts also stated that someone is running an asphalt business in a residential area. Police Chief Sutherland stated that the RV parked at North Hudson and Bart can be addressed by the city's ordinance prohibiting parking to close to a stop sign. Police Chief Sutherland stated that there was no restriction of parking on Stapleton and North Hudson. Steve Mauer, City Attorney, stated that the person using their backyard to store equipment, supplies and put gravel in the back yard can be addressed by the city ordinance that prevents running a business in a residential area. Alderman Butts made a motion to have no parking between signs on both sides of North Hudson from Stapleton to the north property line who is running a business. Alderman Norris seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.



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**7. DISCUSSION, CONSIDERATION AND POSSIBLE ACTION regarding approval of the East Jefferson Road project.**

Alderman Butts stated that he would like to move forward with the East Jefferson Road improvement project. Mayor Box stated he would like to wait until the South Hudson project is completed so we can see what the balance is in the street fund. Alderman Butts tabled the discussion.

**ELECTED OFFICIAL COMMENTS**

Mayor Box stated that Missouri Department of Natural resources sent an email to both City Administrator Bobadilla and him about a previous violation that occurred in 2017. Staff is working to resolve the issues.

Alderman Ross stated that the field behind, and beside, Osage Springs needs to be mowed.

Alderman Kolle asked for an update on repairs of the water meters. City Administrator Bobadilla stated that the only thing that is missing is the antenna.

Alderman Norris asked for a deaf child sign to be removed from Baker Street and asked for an update on the cleanup of 108 Baker Street. Police Chief stated that during the last court date; the judge gave him 10 more days to get the violations into compliance.

Alderman Butts asked about Animal Control. City Administrator Bobadilla Stated that the agreement with Oak Grove has been signed and approved.

Alderman Butts made a motion to have public works cut down the brush that is blocking the view on Broyles and Sibley. Alderman Kolle seconded the motion. All Aldermen voted aye.
